MINUTES OF THE 22nd MEETING OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF MANAV RACHNA UNIVERSITY HELD ON WEDNESDAY, DATED 19.02.2024 AT 12:30 P.M. AT BOARD ROOM, A-BLOCK, M.R. CAMPUS, FARIDABAD.

The 22nd meeting of the Governing Body of Manav Rachna University was held on Monday, Dated 19.02.2024, at 12.30 PM in the Board Room, A Block, Manav Rachna Campus, Faridabad to consider administrative, and academic matters.

Dr. Hemant Verma, Dy. Director, DHE (Govt. nominee) and Sh. Amit Kumar, FCA, Chartered Accountant who could not attend the meeting due to their other professional engagements were granted leave of absence.

The following are the minutes of the meeting:

1. Opening Remarks by the Chairman

The chairman welcomed all the member present in the meeting and stated that the University has been making effort in right direction and doing pretty well. NBA accreditation for B.Tech CSE has already been achieved and now, University has been preparing for Accreditation of NAAC team visit in coming months. Both the Institutions are working in synergy and making joint efforts in all areas for further strengthening the Academics and Research. Some new initiatives are being taken especially in the school of Education & Humanities where it is trying to align its syllabus with IB Board. This will help the school

of education to provide training to the students for both NCRT and IB areas thus improving the prospects of students to serve globally. It will strengthen the programme at Manav Rachna and serve the student community well.

Centre for Advance Learning (CAL) set up by the University is also adding new dimensions and involved in organizing various training programmes. The Chairman also mentioned about the work currently being carried out by Sh. Manish Kumar ji, a member of the GB and advised Vice Chancellor to associate with him.

Chairman also apprised about the newly introduced ITEP (Primary & Secondary) from the Academic Year 2025-26 by the NCTE in lieu of 4 year B.A/B.Sc B.Ed Education programme which will be discontinued from the Year. It is imperative for the existing Institutions offering 4 Yrs in B.A/B.Sc B.Ed programme to join ITEP. B.Ed programme is also proposed to be discontinued after few years.

The Department of Law has been evolving themselves in a new way under the guidance of Justice Mr. U.U. Lalit, former CJI and Chairman of Advisory Board. The members of the Board are providing direction to the School of Law to have its presence felt globally. Justice Mr. U.U. Lalit is also involved in delivering some lecture using new tools and equips students to face challenges of workplace.

He further advised that many other Institutions are marching ahead at a fast pace hence, it is necessary to benchmark with other Institutions and work in the areas which are crucial for branding.

With these words the Chairman concluded his remarks and requested Vice Chancellor to take further. Vice Chancellor extended a warm welcome to all the members and informed about the events/activities which are detailed in **Annexure-I.**

While concluding his remarks, Vice Chancellor requested Registrar to take up agenda for deliberation. Registrar took up the agenda one by one in chronological order for discussion of the Hon'ble members.

2. Confirmation of the Minutes of the 21st meeting of the Governing Body held on 18.10.2024.

The Hon'ble Members were informed that Minutes of the 21st Meeting of the Governing Body was circulated to all the members vide email dated 08.11.2023. No comment was received from any of the members. GB was apprised of the items deliberated upon in the last meeting, and requested to confirm the minutes.

Decision: Governing Body confirmed the minutes of last meeting held on 18.10.2023.

3. Action Taken Report on the decision taken in the 21st meeting of the Governing Body.

Registrar apprised the Hon'ble Members with the action taken by the university on the decisions of the last Meeting of the Governing Body and requested to take the report on record.

Decision: Governing Body took the Action Taken Report on record.

4. Matter for Information

Registrar informed the members about the following items and requested for taking it on record.

i) Decision taken by the Academic Council in its 23rd Meeting held on 24.01.2024.

Registrar informed the Hon'ble members about the agenda taken up for deliberation and decisions taken thereon in the last meeting of the Academic Council held on 24.01.2024

ii) NBA accreditation received in respect of B.Tech CSE program.

The G.B. was informed that B. Tech. CSE Programme of the University has been accredited by the NBA for 3Yrs from 2023 to 2026.

Decision: Governing Body took the above information on record.



5. Consideration of Fee Structure of UG/PG for the Academic Session 2024-25.

GB was apprised that fee structure for all UG/PG programmes proposed to be implemented from the Academic Year 2024-25 was considered by the Finance Committee and BOM and concurred for placing before Governing Body. GB was requested to consider the revised fee structure for the Year 2024-25 and approve the same.

Decision: Governing Body approved the Fee Structure for the AY 2024-25. Approved fee structure for the year 2024-25 is annexed as Annexure-II.

6. Consideration of revised budget 2023-24.

Governing Body was informed that the revised budget estimates for the current financial year 2023-24 was considered by the Finance Committee & then by the BOM. Both have concurred with the same for placing the Governing Body according to revised BE for the Year, has now been shown Rs. **59.50 Cr.** as compared to Rs **62.5/- Cr** projected in the budget estimate for the year 2022-23. The revised expenditure has been projected as Rs. **77.22 Cr** against the initial projection in the BE for Rs. **71.51 Cr.** A total shortfall of **Rs. 17.72 Cr.** is proposed to be met through loan/cr. The GB was requested to consider revised budget for the Year 2023-24 and approve the same.

Decision: Governing Body considered the revised budget for 2023-24 and unanimously approved the same. The approved RE is annexed as Annexure No. III.

7. Consideration of Balance sheet and Annual Accounts for the Financial Year, 2022-23.

It was informed that Finance Committee and Board of Management had considered the audited Balance Sheet for the Year 2022-23 and recommended the same for consideration and approval by Governing Body. The balance sheet was tabled in the Meeting for perusal of the Hon'ble members and with a request to approve the same.

Decision: Governing Body approved the Balance sheet and Annual Accounts for the Financial Year, 2022-23. Approved Balance sheet is annexed as Annexure No. IV.

8. Approval of Scholarship Policy for the year 2024-25.

Governing Body was apprised that the university intends to continue with the



existing scholarships in the Academic Year 2024-25 also with the same criteria except minor change in the categories "I to M" as below for awarding the scholarships:

"The minimum eligibility for Freeship under category from I to M will be 60% marks in aggregate in the qualifying examination"

Further, it was informed that FC & BOM had already concurred for the same was requested to consider the scholarship policy for the Year 2024-25 and approve the same

Decision: Governing Body approved the scholarship policy for the year 2024-25. Approved Scholarships policy for the Year 2024-25 along with and conditions for their continuation are annexed as Annexure No. V.

9. Any other item with permission of the Chairman.

Opening Remarks by the Vice-Chancellor

The Chairman welcomed all the members present in the meeting, He highlighted some of the activities carried out by the university since the last meeting of Board of Management. Some of the points mentioned by the chairman are:

- Manav Rachna Educational Institutions (MREI) began the New Year on an auspicious prayer of week-long Mahamritunjya Puja, the Yagna and Purnahooti was held amidst the august presence of Esteemed Shri. Moolchand Sharma - Transport, Mines & Geology, Elections and Higher Education Minister, Haryana. All the employees who completed 10 years of their service with Manav Rachna were honoured.
- NBA team visited the campus on 29th Sept for the accreditation of B. Tech CSE Program. NBA office has informed that B. Tech. CSE Programme of the University has been accredited for 3Yrs from 2023 to 2026.
- On 28th October University organized its Convocation Ceremony for the batch 2023, During the Convocation 425 UG, 38 PG & 4 Ph.D. Degrees were awarded.
- During this period Manav Rachna University signed MOU with Queensland University (UQ), Haiti in order to foster the development of bilateral cooperation with aim of establishing a mutually beneficial long-term association.
- The MRU has signed MOU with Dr. Suraj Prakash Arogya Kendra, Faridabad to empanel the Centre for benefit of the university employees and students. Dr. Suraj Prakash Arogya Kendra will provide all day care and diagnostic facilities and world class health care service at the most affordable cost to the employees and students of Manav Rachna University.
- The MRU has signed MOU with Amrita Institute of Medical Sciences and Research Centre on 8th February, 2023 for providing various managerial, operational and healthcare opportunities to



Faculty & Staff members and provide internship benefits for the UG/PG students.

- The meeting of the 12th Advisory Board of School of Law, Manav Rachna University was held on 3rd February, 2024. The Advisory Board appreciated the efforts of school of law and gave lot of advices and the same shall be implemented in due course.

Events Organized

- An international conference ICEMRB2023 on the topic "Energy Materials and Rechargeable Batteries-2023" was jointly organized by the School of Sciences and University Instrumentation Center from 19th December to 22 December, 2023. In the conference, speakers from reputed organisations such as IITs, NITs and CSIR labs were invited who delivered plenary, keynote and invited talks. The Powder XRD (Rigaku Miniflex 600) commissioned in the University Instrumentation Center on 15th January 2024. This instrument is being used for qualitative and quantitative Phase analysis of Polycrystalline Material. User Charges for the instrument is Rs 700 per sample for internal users from MREI and 2500 per hour for external users. Till date **69 samples** have been analyzed. The total revenue generated till date is Rs. 7457 (Seven Thousand Four Hundred Fifty Seven Rupees). It is expected that in near Future it will have more usages.

The candidate seeking admission under any of the above categories of sports shall be required to produce the relevant documents of proof of his/her participation and Medal Won. Sports Committee under Director-Sports will take the final decision regarding Scholarship.

The scholarship under this category shall be given in the first semester and its continuation shall be decided by a committee constituted by the Competent Authority of the Institution / University.

There is a Provision of Teaching Assistantship for the candidate enrolled for M.Tech and LLM Programmes, as detailed below:

The selected candidates having more than 70% overall marks or 7.00 CGPA in the qualifying examination shall be provided teaching assistantship on the recommendations of the committee constituted by the Vice-Chancellor of the University. Under this provision, such candidates shall be required to engage with Professors/Associate Professors of the University for Practical and Tutorial Classes with total assignments of 8-10 periods per week and they shall be paid stipend of Rs. 10000/- per month with a maximum limit of payment for 12 months during the complete duration of the M.Tech and MPT programme.

The candidate of M.Tech and LLM Programmes can either avail the above free ship policy for PG programme or Teaching Assistantship.

Note: Total Free ship /Scholarships to students under all categories stated above (from B to G) put to together shall be limited to maximum 20% (5% for 100% of Tuition Fee waiver cases, 5% for 50% of Tuition Fee waiver cases, 5% for 25% of Tuition Fee waiver cases and 5% for 10% of Tuition Fee waiver cases) of the sanctioned intake for the programme of admission.

I) Free ship /Scholarships to the Wards of MREI Employee: 25% Tuition fee Waiver (limiting up to maximum of Rs. 12500/- one time at the time of Admission) to First Child only, however, if first child is already getting scholarship on the basis of Merit then this benefit would be passed to second child, if applicable.

J) Free ship /Scholarships to the Siblings of Manav Rachna Student in any of the HEIs of Manav Rachna: 10% Tuition fee Waiver (limiting up to maximum of Rs. 5000/- only one time at the time of admission) to the Sibling (brother/sister) of Student already enrolled in any of the Programme at HEI of MREI. Only elder one of the siblings would get the said benefit.

K) Free ship /Scholarships to the Alumni of Manav Rachna Educational Institution: Student who is an Alumnus of any of the Manav Rachna Educational Institutions (Schools or HEI), eligible for 10% Tuition fee waiver (limiting up to maximum of Rs. 5000/- only one time at the time of admission) during admission to the programs offered by any of the HEI.

M) RESERVATION OF SEATS AND WAIVER IN TUITION FEES FOR WARDS OF SERVING AND RETIRED PERSONNEL OF ARMED FORCES

Manav Rachna has persistently celebrated merit and holds Indian Army personnel in very high regard for their selfless service to our nation. 5% of the sanctioned intake of all UG & PG programmes will be reserved under the category and the exclusive scholarships granted to the wards of army personnel include:

- 25% waiver on the 1st installment of the tuition fee
- Reserved seat up to 45 days after the declaration of results
- Reservation of hostel seat up to 30 days after the declaration of your result

Requisite Documents Needed to Avail Armed Forces Scholarship

For wards of current service holders

A bonafide letter of proof of current posting by the current service holder.

For wards of ex-service holders (Retired Armed Forces personnel):

A copy of the soldier's book

Note:

- The minimum eligibility for Freeship under category from I to M will be 60% marks in aggregate in the qualifying examination.
- Proof of relationship is to be provided wherever applicable
- For continuity of scholarship (wherever applicable), University Scholarship policy would be applicable from 2nd semester
- The candidate can avail scholarship/freeship under one scheme only, whichever is higher, out of the above listed schemes subject to availability of scholarship seats.

N) MERIT CUM MEANS SCHOLARSHIP FOR DOMICILE STUDENTS OF HARYANA

Manav Rachna offers Scholarship based on merit cum means, to the candidates admitted under reservation for Haryana Candidates. Scheme shall be applicable to all Undergraduate and Post Graduate Programs. The Scheme is applicable to all the students whose parents have annual income up to Rs.2.80 Lac from all sources. Under the scheme, the students shall be given fee waiver limited to the tuition fee as per the following scale. Candidates are required to pay other fee as applicable to the programme concerned.

- One fifth of the 25% shall be granted 100% tuition fee concession,



- Two fifth of the 25% shall be granted 50% tuition fee concession,
- The balance two fifth of the 25% shall be granted 25% tuition fee concession.

O) Suitable free ship shall be available to high achievers in the field of sports, persons suffering with Thalassaemia Major, sons / daughters of Army Personnel who have been killed in war/ terrorist attack, physically handicapped students etc. on case to case basis.

Conditions for Continuation of Free ship / Scholarship in Subsequent semesters mentioned above:

Progress of students awarded scholarship in subsequent semesters shall be reviewed after end of every semester for continuation, based upon his/her performance in the previous semester. For continuation of scholarship student shall be required to:

- Maintain a minimum SGPA of 7.5 in each semester without any backlog.
- Have 85% attendance in all courses in each semester.
- Applicant should not have been suspended for any grave act of indiscipline by the university.
- No disciplinary action against the applicant is established or pending in case of ragging or eve teasing.
- The applicant should not be receiving any other scholarship from any other source whatsoever, for which a certificate signed by student & parents is to be provided.

NOTE:

- For purpose of Scholarship/tuition fee waiver, the marks will not be rounded off to the next higher figure and calculation of percentage of marks shall be made on the basis of eligibility subjects in the qualifying examination (same number of subjects).

MERIT SCHOLARSHIP TO SEMESTER/BRANCH TOPPERS

In order to motivate the students for better and sustained academic performance, ManavRachna offers 'Merit Scholarship to Semester/Branch Toppers' enumerated below for students securing 1st, 2nd and 3rd positions in the Odd & Even semester exams (Based on the amalgamated SGPA/CGPA) every year for each programme being run at ManavRachna, as under:

- First Position: Rs.15000/-
- Second Position: Rs.10000/-
- Third Position: Rs. 7500/-

The following are the guidelines for granting these Merit Scholarships:

1. Any programme having strength of 90 students or more in semester exam shall qualify for first, second and third position scholarship.
2. Any programme having strength more than 50 students and less than 90 students in semester exam shall qualify for first and second position scholarship, otherwise only a solitary topper shall be given a first position scholarship.
3. If the strength of a course is 10 or less no scholarship will be awarded for that course.
