The third Advisory Board Meeting was conducted on 18 May 2022 at the India International Center, New Delhi. It was presided over by Padma Vibhushan Dr. Karan Singh and attended by Dr. Amit Bhalla, Vice President, MREI and other distinguished members.

The ABM paid homage to Honourable Justice R C Lahoti, the Vice Chairman of the Advisory Board of MRCPS who left for the heavenly abode on 23<sup>rd</sup> March 2022. The members observed two minute silence in honour of the departed soul. All members recalled his contributions to society and guidance to MRCPS with reverence.

Dr. Karan Singh while delivering the Chairman's address, mentioned about three biggest calamities of modern times that are Climate change, Pandemic and International war conditions, causing global political instability, ecological issues, and the threat of nuclear wars. The need today in the society is to proactively build and sustain peace in a conscious manner. He mentioned that as per Shri Arbindo "The human is defined by his orientation towards the future and his power of self-evolution." To awaken the tendencies of self-evolution, it is essential to strengthen the consciousness among youth. Though it will require sufficient time to achieve this goal yet there is the need of strengthening interfaith movement and initiatives of Temple of Understanding in order to attain peace in society. He further stressed upon the requirement of teaching students 'learning to live together' which is the important pillar of education. Application of the National Education policy-2020 also puts stress on holistic Education and focus on Value inculcation through interdisciplinary approach to sensitize and awaken students for the need of peace and sustainable development. He lauded the efforts and progress of MRCPS in sensitizing students to practice harmonious living. He asserted that there is a growing social division in the communities leading to self-destruction, which can be addressed only through building sustainable peace in a conscious manner by fusion of sciences and humanities.

Dr. Amit Bhalla, Vice President, MRIE, in his address highlighted the practices followed in all constituents of MR group of institutions (two Universities and twelve Schools), in developing the right attitude in youth toward peace and sustainability which can help in building a peaceful society and nation building. He shared good practices and initiative of Manav Rachna Educational Institutions, like Revival of Badkal lake, Teacher on call programme, Innovations, Entrepreneurship in the area of sustainability, Industry connect and faculty enhancement programme with industry etc. He also shared the concept and need to work in the area of virtual water and alternative of Millet food production. He emphasized on appropriate amalgamation of education and sustainability in the Learning processes, through which the youth can be a catalyst in promotion of Peace and Sustainability.

Dr. I K Bhat, gave overview of initiative and progress of NEP implementation in Manav Rachna University like multidisciplinary approach with recency and relevance of content, pedagogical practices, Technology integrated learning, Innovations and Entrepreneuship practices, Research practices to solve local problems, industry collaborative in teaching and learning process.

Dr. Geeta Thakur, presented a detailed Report on activities and achievements of the center carried out since the last meeting of advisory board. She informed that MRCPS has organized activities in five Verticals successfully. All the activities have been the result of student driven initiatives. Various competitions, trainings, workshops, campaigns, rallies etc. have been carried out by them. Some of the initiatives that have had a huge participation are interactions with sustainability crusaders, creation of Butterfly Garden, ANG project, Pahal, Masti ki Pathshala, Peace wall etc. The faculty members associated with the centre also worked on development of courses, curriculum mapping, FDPs, Conference, research projects and many more. Dr. Geeta shared with members of the Advisory Board the future plans like "For the cause: Green Warriors", "Raindrop" for creating eco-friendly and low cost learning zones. She appealed to Advisory Board members to provide suggestions and desired that their involvement with the center is of vital importance. She informed that in the upcoming project "Shantyonnati" and Book on "Role of Higher Education in Peace and Sustainability in Indian Context" will help students to see a broader picture.

Thereafter, Hon'ble chairman requested other members to give their inputs and suggestions for the future activities of the centre of peace & sustainability.

Lt. Gen. S C Kochhar stated that Academia must have outcomes which enables employment generation and are socially relevant. He appreciated the initiatives of MRCPS which has helped in becoming socially relevant. He further lauded the efforts of the university for the involvement of industry in designing and delivery of courses jointly.

Prof. Dr. Muzaffar Ahmad, Former Director General Health, Govt. of J & K and former Member National Disaster Commission complemented and appreciated the work carried out by the centre. He expressed the concern regarding resilient health system in the era of health uncertainties at global level. He suggested to emphasize on public health through the centre and educate students from all disciplines to carry out projects in this area. Climate Change is going to worsen the public health problem in future. He was of the view that country needs more nonmedical professionals along with medical professional in order to mitigate the impact of climate change and other associated issues. University can play a great contribution regarding public health especially faculty development in this area. The students who pass out from university must have knowledge and skills for handling of Disaster Management issues. He suggested that MR should expand its efforts outside Faridabad and Haryana in order to broaden its reach, since the programmes and initiatives undertaken by the center have potential influence growth.

Dr. Markandey Rai, Senior Advisor, UN Habitat, advised that MRCPS must collaborate with the regional director of UNESCO in order to take MR's initiative to a higher level". He asserted

that, the center should invite famous Indian International personalities who have solid understanding in the specific area of peace and sustainability to provide guidance and direction. He also brought to the attention of the members that there is need to understand the tremendous possibilities and treasure that lies in sea and to understand importance of Blue Economy for sustainable growth of India. He also stressed upon the need of making society and schools aware about sustainable development goals. He appreciated the initiative of Youth Peace and Sustainability Club which is a part of MRCPS of Manav Rachna University. He was of the view that all universities should establish a peace club and students should come together and promote peace. He suggested to invite Legendary Nonresident Indians to have interaction with students and motivate them. There is need to develop a data base of these NRIs to connect with them. Dr. Rai further suggested instead of separate Security Council, there should be Upper House of interfaith people to attain peace at international level. The advisory board members emphasized the need of having psychology counselors in campuses to support students in gaining psychological stability post the traumatic experiences during the pandemic.

Dr. D. S. Sengar, Pro Vice Chancellor in his remarks expressed gratitude to the august Advisory Board for mentoring and setting direction to achieve goals of the center.

Dr. Pradeep Varshney shared about ongoing research projects in university like Metal air battery, initiatives of scrap industry to solve the problem of solid waste management. This has become more relevant as Electrical & Electronic autonomous vehicles is on the growth path.

Mr. Ansh Ohri, a student representative, expressed the sincere thanks and shared his learning experiences in Manav Rachna Centre for Peace and Sustainability and said that the center has helped him to become more compassionate and supportive to the cause of peace.

Ms. Durga Bhardwaj, student president of MRU, extended thanks for the learning experience from dignitaries. She expressed opinion that there is need to bring awareness among students and she further ensured to work for instill habits and bring positive attitude among youth through MRCPS.

Dr. Sanjay Srivastava, Vice Chancellor and Managing Director, MRIE expressed gratitude to the august Advisory Board members for sparing their valuable time. He summarized the deliberations by all Advisory Board members. Dr. Srivastava promised to bring momentum for the cause of peace and sustainability.

The advisory board members expressed appreciation of the progress made by MRCPS and the confidence that the center will achieve the objectives through the several training programs, projects and initiatives to promote Peace and Sustainability. The members expressed appreciation of the initiatives undertaken at the center regarding courses that are being offered, students club activities directed towards peace, seminars and other events organized by the center.






