
High Participation: "Nai Disha" received an overwhelming response, with individuals from diverse backgrounds and age groups participating in the competition.

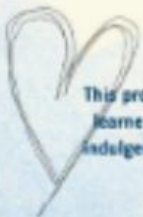

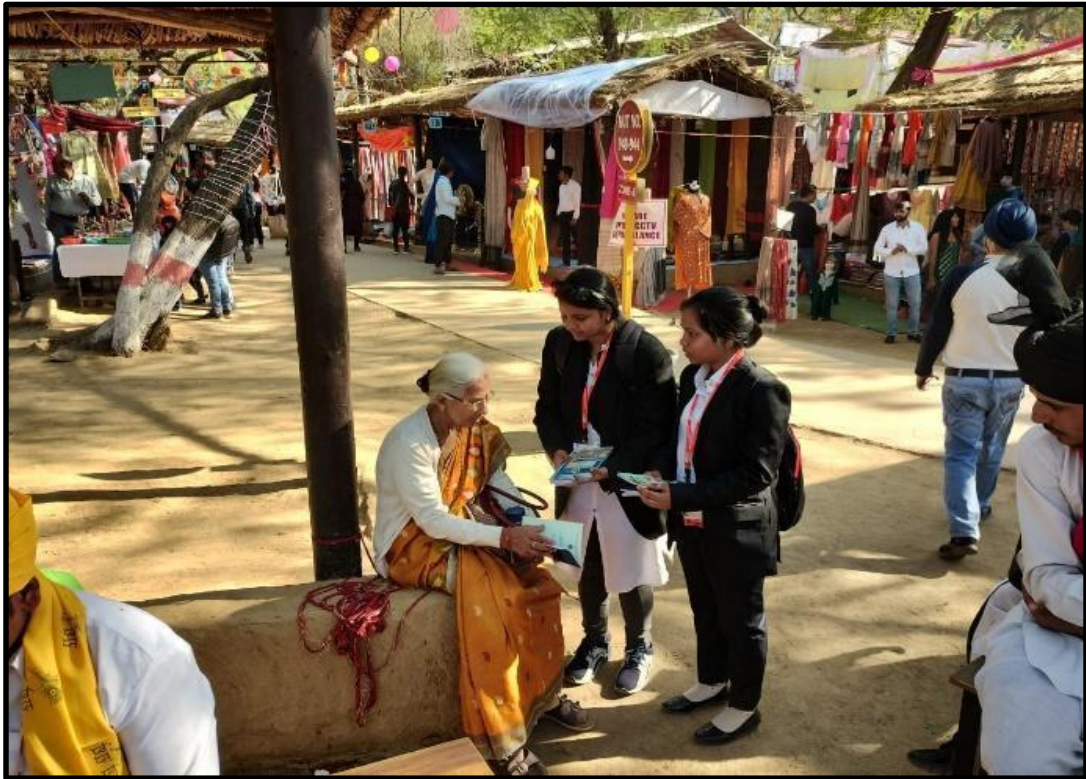


Legal Aid Camp At Surajkund Craft International Mela, Feb 2023

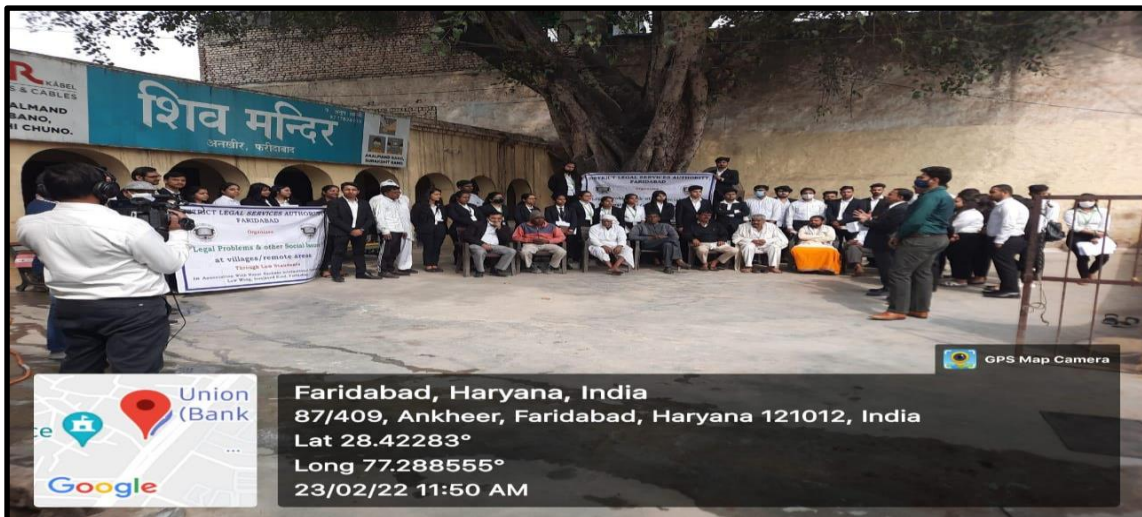




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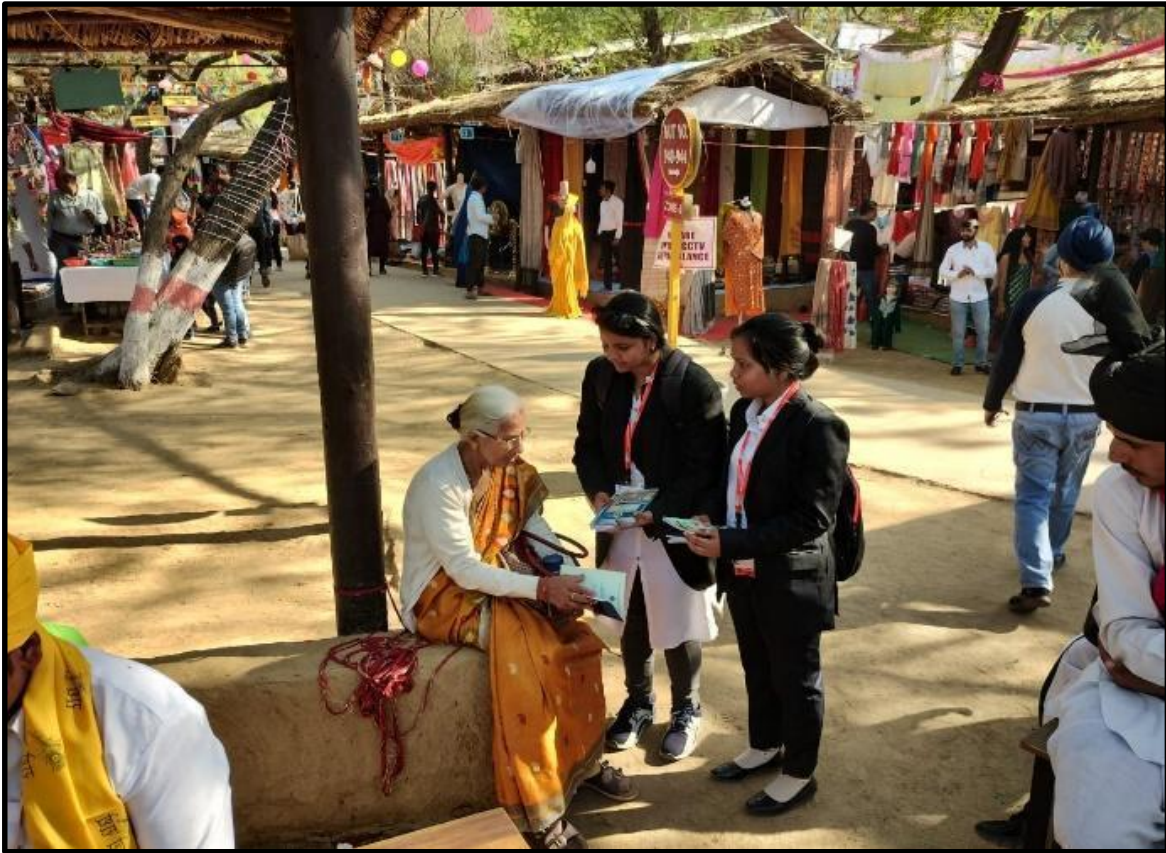


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Community Connect Program

We live in a country where not all children get the privilege to live with all the comforts. There have been various NGOs in India who work for these children and help them grow and learn. MANAV SHISHU SADAN (REGD.) AANCHAL is one such organization known for the selfless efforts in the upliftment of the society. They are known for providing these children a bright future.



DAY₃₀: On my last day of internship, we studied, played together, clicked pictures together, also they showed me how do they stitch clothes, make decorative candles etc. The last of internship was the best and memorable day for me. I've so far shared lots and lots of beautiful memories with these children and gifting them pencils, erasers and chocolates and making them smile was one of the best things of the internship. Also, I look forward to meet them again.



On an average, I used to spend 1-1.5 hours daily. I used to there around 11:00am (from third or fourth day).

After 2-4 days, the children got familiar with me and we started lots of fun during their school time. We started reciting tables together, counting numbers, reading together etc. The children there were very enthusiastic, joyful, happy and most importantly they have the sense of sharing. These students used to share their lunch with other students.

During this time, we studied basic concepts of English, Hindi and Mathematics.



DESCRIPTION OF INTERNSHIP EXPERIENCE:

I've taught these kids from June 25, 2022 to July 25, 2022. My experience of Day 1 and Day 30 was very different.

DAY1: Mrs. Janak Gupta introduced me to the care takers of the children. She explained me the time table of the kids which includes their lunch time, playing time, extra-curricular activities time etc. Also, she told me about different children enrolled in the NGO and their hobbies. I was very excited to meet these kids. The kids usually arrive at 9:45am. On my first day, these children hesitated taking to me, making eye contact with me.

ABOUT THE NGO:

MANAV SHISHU SADAN (REGD.) AANCHAL is a non-governmental organization (established in 2000), located in Gandhi Nagar, Ghaziabad which deals with the education and extra-curricular activities of children with special needs. Their objective is to make every special child independent by providing them education and overall development of the kid which includes grooming their personal talents and even giving them emotional support. The founder of the NGO is Mrs. Janak Gupta. She herself is a mother of two differently abled girls and the desire to make them educated and independent led to the opening of this NGO. The NGO also organizes different activities like fancy dress competition, dance competition every Saturday to make them engage. They also take part in activities held on various district or state levels. The NGO is funded by the fees of these students and by the donations given by the local citizens.
