ABOUT THE COURSE

This divergence between what works in the traditional classroom within stable cohort of learners communicating synchronously F2F is qualitatively different from an online asynchronous one. The course will enable you to design and execute your teaching in an online environment effectively based on constructivism strategies which will foster the students' engagements. This course shall be useful for teachers, trainers, and all persons interested in design and delivery of instruction in an online mode effectively with constructivist perspective.

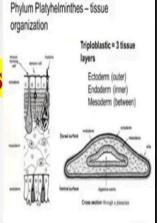

► **Body Structure:** definite polarity of anterior(head) and posterior(tail).
Cephalization starts in this phylum

► **Body Wall:** Epidermis is single layered ,syncytial and ciliated.
In parasitic animals it contains thick cuticle on body wall, which is called tegument (its secreted by epidermis)

Mesodermal muscular layers(longitudinal, circular and oblique)is present just beneath of basement membrane


Tegument: Outer cytoplasmic Layer, it is consistent with the cytoplasmic processes of certain tegument secreting cells.

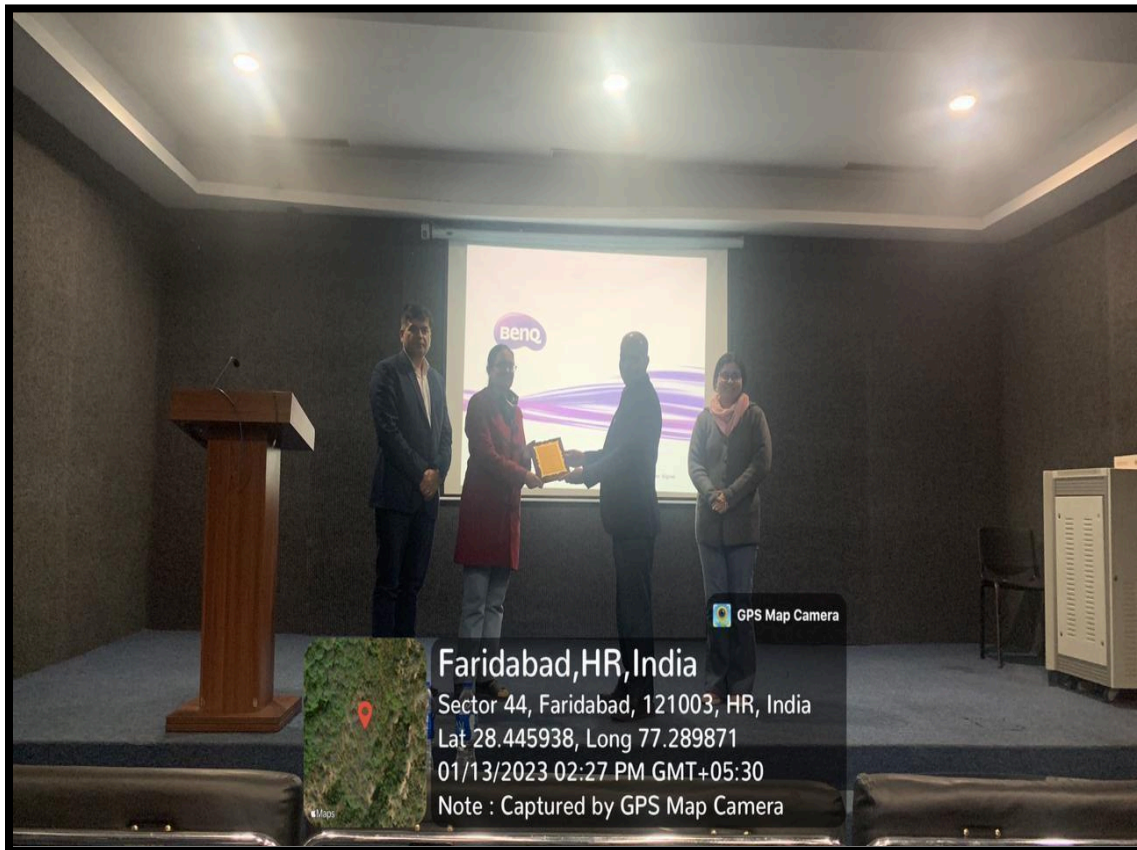

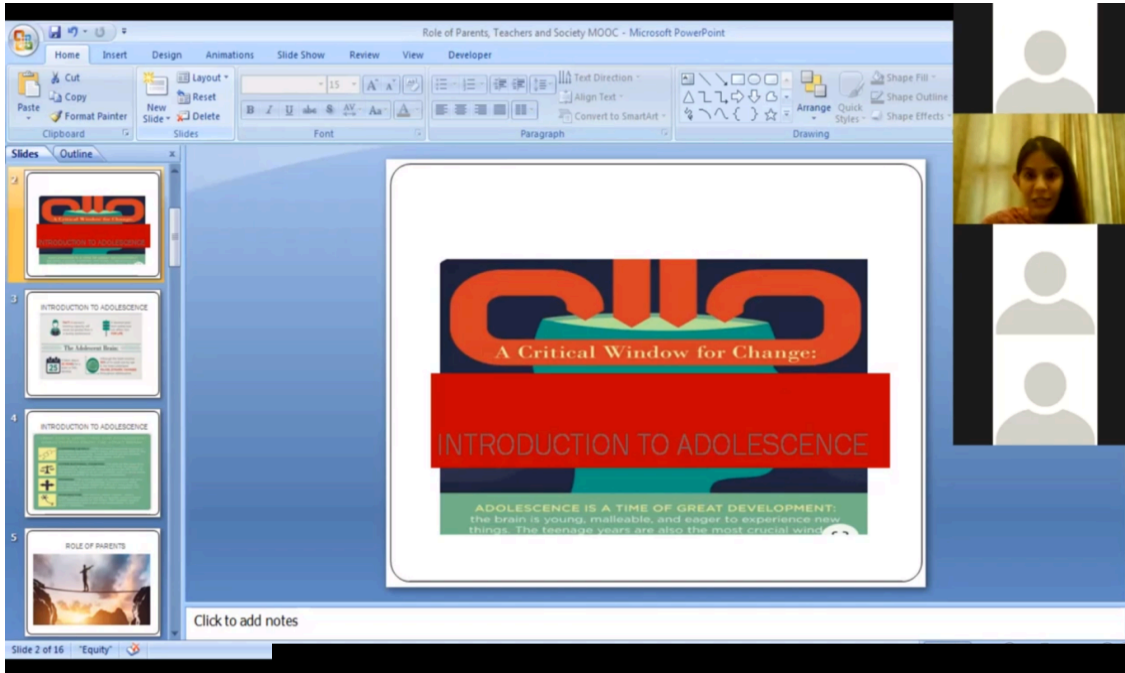

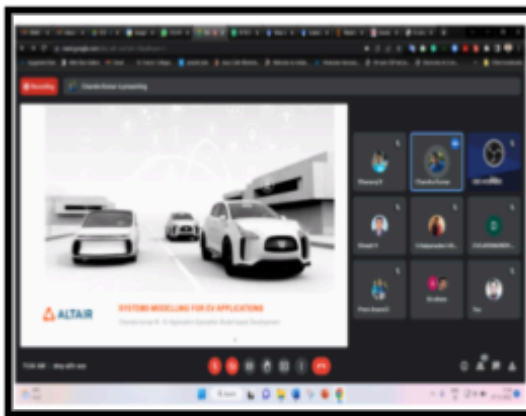
Short Term Course on “SCILAB Programming for Beginners

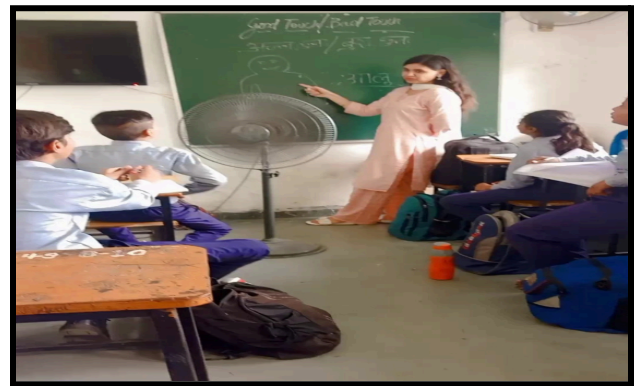

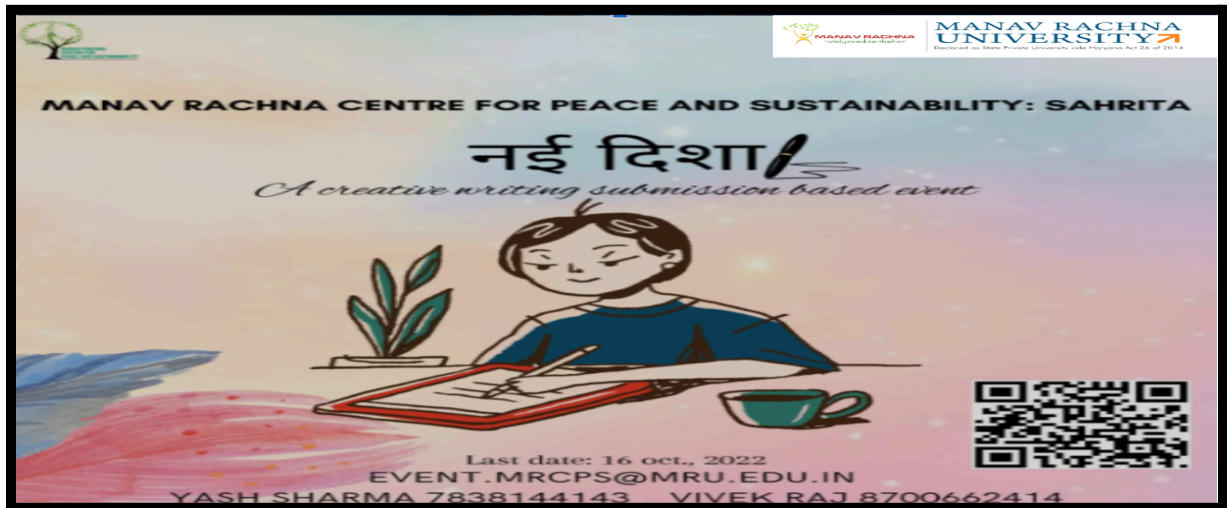

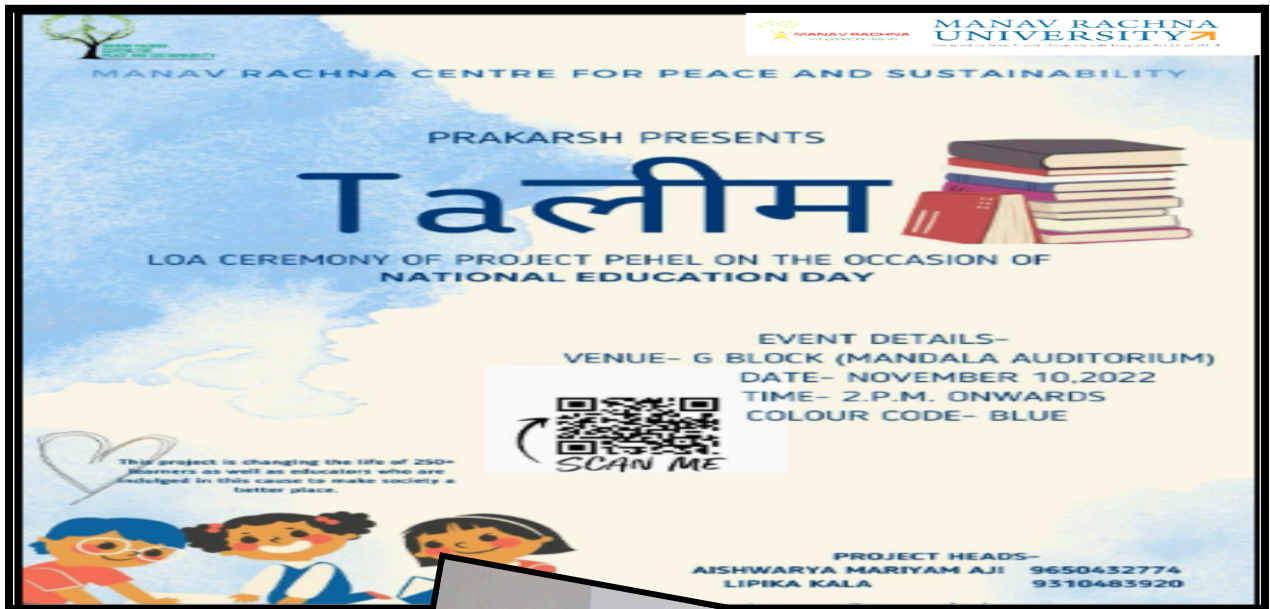


of educators to shape the character, caliber, and future of individuals, echoing the words of Dr. A.P.J. Abdul Kalam.

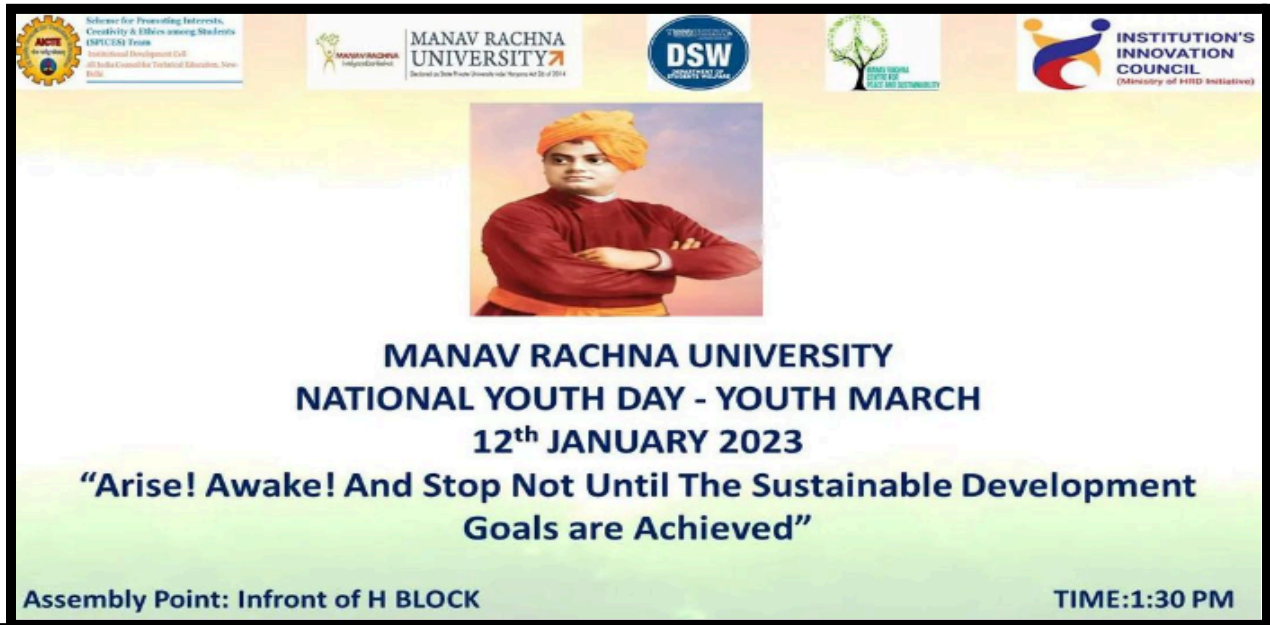

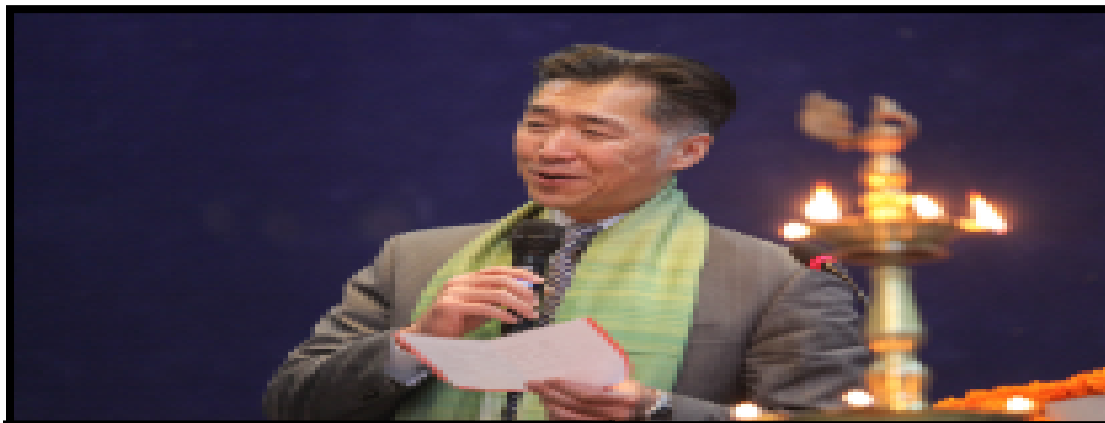
Sustainathon Inter College

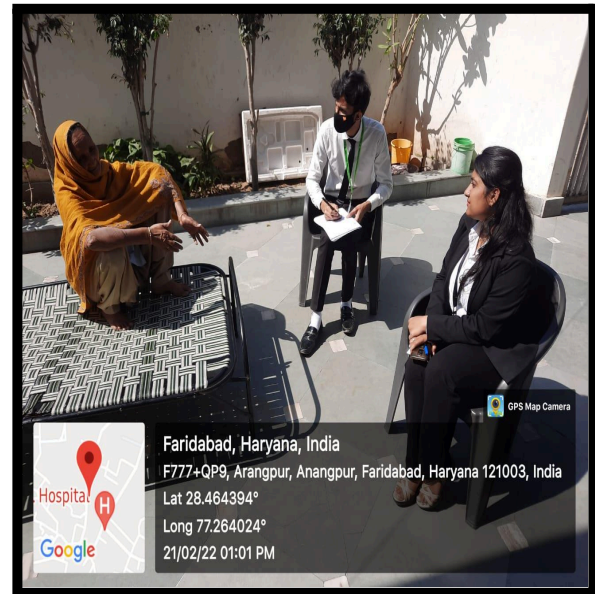




Legal Aid And Awareness Camp Report on 17th Jan, 2023

Conclusion

The session concluded with a call to action for teachers to embrace the changes proposed by NEP 2020. Participants expressed their commitment to enhancing educational practices and ensuring that every child receives quality education.

Recommendations

- Continuous professional development for teachers on NEP implementation.
- Regular workshops to foster collaboration among NGO schools.
- Creation of resource materials to assist teachers in adapting to new methodologies.

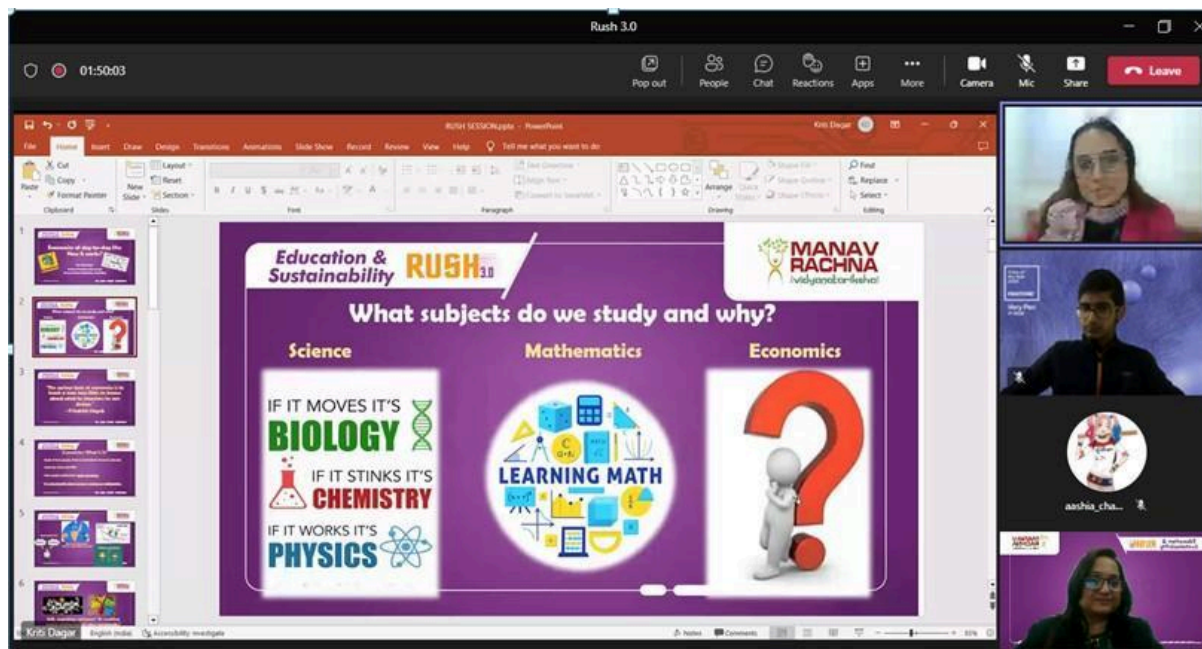
Topic: Economics of day-to-day life: How it works?

The presentation was supplemented with a pictorial review activity where the students had to analyze pictures on the basis of the economic concepts of life discussed.

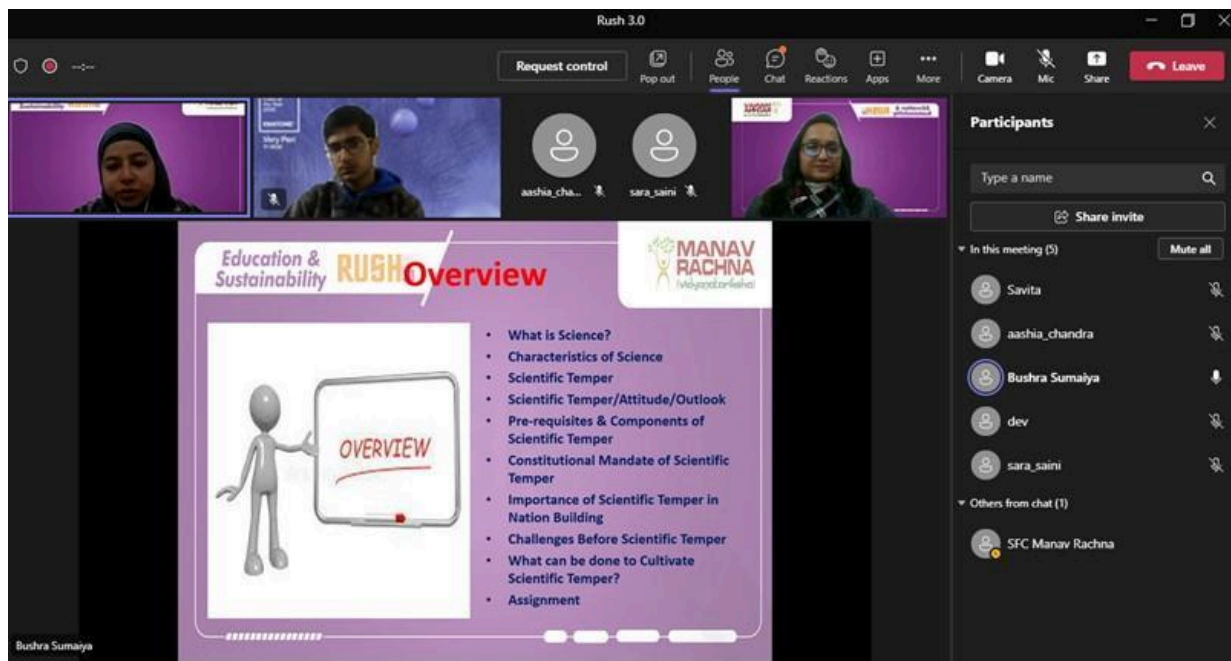


Topic: Cultivating Scientific Temper

SCHOLARSHIP 2022-23

Manav Rachna University's Scholarship and Financial Assistance

Manav Rachna University (MRU) has demonstrated a significant commitment to supporting students through various scholarships and financial assistance programs. During the academic year 2022-23, a wide range of schemes were offered to students based on merit, economic need, sports achievements, and special considerations. These initiatives have alleviated financial burdens for students, enabling them to focus on academic and personal growth.

Scholarship and Assistance Schemes

The following are the key categories of scholarships and financial assistance provided by MRU in 2022-23:

1. Merit-Based Scholarships:

- 100% Tuition Fee Waiver based on marks/CGPA in qualifying exams benefited 90 students with an outlay of INR 7,860,100.
- 50%, 25%, and 10% Tuition Fee Waivers based on marks/CGPA supported 128, 183, and 43 students respectively, with respective amounts of INR 5,350,400, INR 3,860,150, and INR 421,850.

2. Scholarships for Economically Weaker Sections (EWS):

- For Haryana domicile students under the Merit Cum Means Scholarship, MRU offered 100%, 50%, and 25% Tuition Fee Waivers benefiting 9, 17, and 6 students respectively, with amounts totaling INR 913,000, INR 821,000, and INR 158,625.

3. Performance-Based Scholarships:

- Merit scholarships for semester/branch toppers were provided at 25%, 15%, and 10% Tuition Fee Waiver levels, benefiting 17 and 1 students in the 25% and 10% categories with INR 274,025 and INR 5,500 allocated respectively.

4. Need-Based Free Ship:

- A significant amount of INR 11,260,200 was allocated to provide fee waivers for 152 students under the need-based free ship program, ensuring financial accessibility for students in need.

5. In-House Ph.D. Scholarships:

- MRU allocated INR 245,000 to support 17 students pursuing doctoral studies, fostering academic research and development within the university.

6. Sibling and Alumni Scholarships:

- Scholarships for siblings and alumni of Manav Rachna Educational Institutions were offered, benefiting 21 and 15 students respectively with total amounts of INR 133,400 and INR 76,000.

7. Sports-Based Scholarships:

- 50% and 25% Tuition Fee Waivers were awarded to outstanding achievers in sports, assisting 2 and 3 students with amounts of INR 142,000 and INR 69,250.

8. Special Entrance Exam-Based Scholarships:

- Scholarships based on performance in MRNAT and LSAT were provided, benefiting 1, 21, 32, and 4 students with various percentages of Tuition Fee Waivers, amounting to INR 112,000, INR 768,050, INR 593,875, and INR 58,450.

9. Other Special Categories:

- Fee waivers for wards of MREI employees, wards of army personnel, and girl child students were also provided, supporting 1, 1, and 140 students with respective amounts of INR 90,000, INR 12,500, and INR 634,700.

10. Dr. O.P. Bhalla Foundation Special Fee Freeship:

- Through this foundation, 70 students received financial support totaling INR 2,260,977.

Total Financial Support Provided

The total number of students supported through various scholarships and fee waivers by the institution was 862 with a cumulative amount of approximately INR 38,267,477.
